Problem Statement and Data

- Current policy does not clearly state whether prior living organ donors should get priority with <u>each and every</u> kidney registration or just <u>one</u> registration
- Since 1996
 - 280 prior living donors listed for kidney transplant
 - 33 prior living donors listed for more than one kidney transplant





Proposal

 Policy language would clearly state that the local priority and 4 points for prior living donors applies with each and every kidney registration.





Feedback and Cost Estimates

- Public Comment: 59 in favor, 2 opposed, and 17 had no comment.
- Committee votes: 6 in favor, 0 opposed, and 14 did not vote.
- Regional votes: 11 in favor, 0 opposed.
- RAIS: Project Size- Very small; Implementation Cost-\$4,652; Annual Maintenance Estimate- 40 hours. Does not require additional programming in UNetSM.
