Re: Guidance on Reporting Hemodynamic Measures for the Lung Allocation Score

(LAS)

The Thoracic Organ Transplantation Committee offers the following guidance to thoracic transplant programs for reporting hemodynamic measures for the LAS:

Policy 3.7.6.1 (Lung Allocation – Candidates Age 12 and Older) requires transplant centers to report hemodynamic measurements in order to calculate a candidate's LAS including. The intent of the provision is to capture such measures while the candidate is <u>at rest</u>. Pulmonary hemodynamic measurements are important predictors of waitlist mortality and post-transplant survival, and were derived and validated for the LAS in the resting condition. Therefore, reporting hemodynamic pressures taken while a candidate is exercising, or immediately following exercise, does not meet the intent of the policy.
